Animal Birth Control campaign going strong

Our Animal Birth Control (ABC) Campaign ran successfully in January. Altogether, we have been able to spay 260 female dogs, and neuter 50 male dogs this month. As more people become aware of the benefits of birth control surgeries through our campaign, more people have started to get involved byinforming us about community dogs in their locality and have also been helping us collect them.

Fundraising sales at farmer's markets

With the huge success of our fundraising stall at Utpala's Christmas market, we were inspired to put similar stalls this month as well. This time, we put our stall at two farmers' marketplaces: one at Utapala Cafe and the other at Kyampa Social Club, Sanepa. All proceeds from the sales at both of these stalls were used for the benefit of the animals in our shelter.

Preventive Measures



FMD Vaccination

Foot-and-mouth disease is a highly contagious viral disease that affects cloven-hoofed animals like cows, goats, pigs and as a part of the regular vaccination programmes at our shelter, we gave our animals FMD vaccines.



Blood and fecal sampling

We take regular blood and fecal tests of all our animals to learn about how their vital organs are functioning so we can act on time to prevent any bigger mishaps in future. This month, we had taken routine blood and fecal samples from the cattles at our shelter.

Mobile Treatment







Our mobile treatment service is going good as always. Here are some photos of our team in the field providing treatment to the community dogs.

Thanks to the relentless support from <u>Dogs Trust Worldwide</u>, we were able to continue our mobile treatment services in January too. We look forward to helping even more animals in the coming days.



Puppies left at our gate

We have had cases of both healthy as well as sick dogs and puppies left at our gate from time and again. In the month of January alone, 13 puppies, including one with a tumor on his cheek and one paralyzed puppy were left in front of our gate.

We provided them shelter and necessary treatments and care. We try to raise awareness among people about the consequences of young puppies being separated from their mothers and the risk they face when living amongst other diseased animals in the shelter.



Surviving the winter

Like every winter, we tried our best to help our animals stay warm throughout the cold days. For dogs, we had provision of heaters in every cell and we had warm blankets and cushions for the dogs who needed to be kept separately. All the animals in our shelter were provided with warm and nutritious foods to help them fight the cold.



Rescued and sheltered

For the serious cases that need to monitored closely and regularly, we rescue them and keep them in our shelter. Since we cannot turn blind eye to the dogs and puppies abandoned in front of our gate, we provide shelter to them as well. Including the dogs we brought in our shelter for treatment and the puppies left at gate, we rescued and sheltered total 21 dogs this month.



Visits and donations

We truly feel privileged when people put their trust in us and spend their valuable time and money for our organization. We had a total 22 visitors and donors this month who donated us cash, foods, blankets and dog clothes.

We were also very touched by an exemplary gesture of one of our donors who provided hair-cutting services to people for months so he could raise funds for our organization.

January has overall been a good month and a good start of the new year for us. We hope we will be able to achieve much more in the upcoming months. See you all
