Need for Long Term Partnership and Cooperation amongst NGOs

A Workshop on "Building Long Term Partnership and Cooperation among Non-Governmental Animal Welfare Organizations in Nepal" was organized by Sneha's Care with the support of EAA. We organized this workshop as we felt that the Federation of Animal Welfare Nepal (FAWN) and organizations like us need to work in coordination and collaborate with other similar groups to address animal welfare issues in Nepal. The workshop had 22 participants from different animal welfare organizations and reached a consensus on a number of key issues among which the general agreement was reached to form a long-term partnership building in different components of animal welfare issues and push for the animal welfare act.



Animal Welfare based Research in Nepal

A workshop on "Status, Scope, and Challenges of Animal Welfare based Research in Nepal" was organized by Sneha's Care with the support of EAA. The objective of this workshop was to braodify the scope of animal welfare-based research in Nepal. Around 30 participants from different government, non-government agencies, academies, and animal welfare practitioners participated in the program and discussed the national and global dynamics and scope of animal welfare issues along with challenges faced by Nepalese researchers. The workshop concluded with several commitments by different organizations to expand the animal welfare research in Nepal.



Animal Welfare Issues in Development Projects in Nepal

A Workshop on "Incorporating Animal Welfare Issues in Development Projects in Nepal" was organized to discuss how animal welfare issues can be incorporated while conducting different development projects throughout Nepal. As Nepal is a developing country, many donor agencies are launching various development projects every week but unfortunately, only a few of them have prioritized the issues of animal welfare. This workshop was a first of its kind and almost all participants showed an interest to incorporate animal welfare components in their later projects.



UPDATE: Dog Population Management

An increase in the number of stray dogs is turning out to be a big problem in the Kathmandu valley. The rise in their numbers in the streets of Kathmandu is making it difficult for their survival can cause problems for humans too. The solution to this is the sterilization of street dogs. This month we were able to sterilize



Field Treatment / Rescues / Shelter

As usual, we provided field treatments for sick and injured dogs on a daily basis. A mobile treatment team from Sneha's Care works 7 days a week treating street dogs of the Lalitpur area and sometimes of Kathmandu as well. Depending upon the case severity, we treat animals on the field and also bring them to our shelter for further medication. This month we treated 127 dogs. Currently, we have over 170 dogs, 30 cows, 9 pigs, and 7 goats at our shelter and farms. This month we rescued 15 dogs.
