When we found him, he was covered in fleas and ticks, scared, and completely alone. Our team rushed to the location, rescued him, and provided immediate medical care. Nandi is now safe at our shelter, receiving the love and care he deserves.

Angel was abandoned and left in danger by her previous owner. She was attacked by other dogs before being brought to our shelter. Angel is one of the saddest souls here. She finds it very hard to trust humans and is struggling to adjust to the shelter environment. We're doing everything we can to comfort her, but she's still scared and distant.

Angel is also suffering from a spinal nerve injury. We've started physical therapy, but her recovery is slow. She seems heartbroken, and it's hard to watch her in pain. Please pray for Angel. 





Fighter


Fighter came to our shelter in very bad shape.

He had been hurt in a dog fight and had a large, deep bite wound on his front left leg. He was bleeding a lot and very weak when he arrived. It was clear he had been through something terrible.

Our team quickly gave him the medical care he needed. We stopped the bleeding, cleaned the wound, and gave him medicine to fight infection. For the first few days, we didn't know if he would survive.

But Fighter is strong just like his name.

Little by little, he started to get better. He began to eat, wag his tail, and trust us. He's still healing and needs more care, but he's already come so far.



Champi

Champi was brought to our shelter in a critical condition, showing severe jaundice with yellow discoloration clearly visible in her eyes, mouth, and stomach region. Recognizing the urgency, we admitted her immediately into our care. Within the shelter, we began a course of medication and supportive treatment to stabilize her condition.

Our team closely monitored her progress, provided her with a calm, clean environment and the medical attention she needs as she continues to fight through this serious illness.

Hit and Run Cases



Barfi

Barfi is a gentle and innocent soul who became the unfortunate victim of a tragic hit-and-run accident. When she was found, she was in severe pain, unable to stand, and visibly frightened. Upon immediate rescue, our veterinary team conducted a thorough examination and confirmed that she had suffered a serious fracture to her left femur bone.

Thanks to the swift action of our rescue team, Barfi was brought to safety and is now receiving the urgent medical care she so desperately needs. She has undergone initial treatment and is currently resting in the warmth and comfort of our shelter, where she is being closely monitored and given round-the-clock care.



Bhuntey

Bhuntey is a gentle and resilient female dog who was brought to our shelter after being the victim of a heartbreaking hit-and-run accident. She had suffered a painful fracture in her right hind limb and was in clear distress when she arrived.

Despite the trauma she endured, Bhuntey showed strength and trust from the very beginning. Our team acted quickly to assess her condition, and she is now receiving the urgent medical care she needs to begin her recovery.

Though her injury is serious, Bhuntey is safe now, surrounded by people who truly care. She's resting in a quiet, comforting space at our shelter where she is being closely monitored and gently supported through her healing journey.





Champi, a mother dog, was brought alone to our shelter in a critical condition, suffering from severe jaundice. The yellowing in her eyes, mouth, and stomach area indicated a serious health issue that required immediate attention. We admitted her right away and began medication and supportive treatment within the shelter.

A few days later, her puppies were also brought to us. They were not sick, but it was clear they had been missing their mother and were in need of care and comfort. We reunited them with Champi at the shelter. which brought visible relief to both her and the pups. Champi, despite her illness, showed incredible strength and remained loving and attentive to her babies throughout her recovery.

With regular treatment, rest, and a nurturing environment, Champi gradually healed. Once she fully recovered, we were happy to return her to her own community, healthy and reunited with the surroundings she knew.


RABIES CASE ALERT



We were recently informed by residents of Ward 22, Lalitpur Metropolitan City, about an aggressive dog causing panic in the neighborhood. The dog was displaying unusual and threatening behavior—trying to bite people and other animals without provocation.

Our rescue team immediately responded and arrived at the scene. The dog showed clear signs that raised suspicion of rabies: excessive drooling, unprovoked aggression, erratic behavior, and aversion to water. Using extreme caution, our team safely rescued the dog and brought it in for medical observation. Unfortunately, the test result came back positive

for rabies.






