MAY 23, 2025

An interactive program on the current status of animal welfare in Nepal and the need and importance of animal welfare was held under the chief guestship of the Honorable Minister of Agriculture and Livestock Development, Shri Ramnath Adhikari.



In the context of the urgent need for an Animal Welfare Act in Nepal, the incumbent Minister has expressed his commitment to promulgate the Animal Welfare Act within the next 2 months, while the esteemed Mayor of Lalitpur Metropolitan City, Chiribabu Maharjan, has expressed his commitment to promulgate the local Animal Welfare Act from the winter or annual session after the promulgation of the Federal Animal Welfare Act.

CONTINUES FOR ANOTHER MONTH

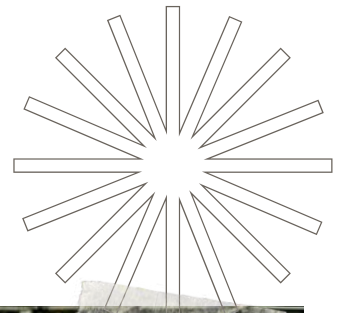

NOT ALL FAREWELL'S ARE SAD

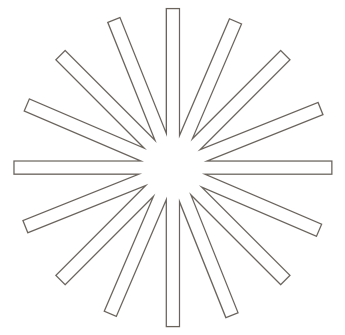

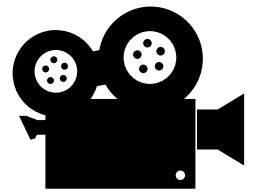
Despite the trauma she endured, Luna's story is one of resilience, healing, and second chances. We couldn't be happier for her.

HEARTBREAKING

CASE OF ABANDONMENT

A CASE SO BRUTAL AND HEARTACHING

In mid-May, we came across a heartbreaking sight—a young male calf lying helplessly in rain, lying soaked in the pitched road near a riverbank close to our shelter.

Our team rushed to the scene with the ambulance, only to find him in agonizing pain, his internal organs protruding from his body. It was a moment of deep sorrow and urgency, a reminder of the suffering so many voiceless beings endure in silence. After thorough examination, our vet doctors concluded that he couldn't be saved.



A RESPECTFUL BURIAL

Although the person who abandoned him may have seen him as worthless, we saw a life that mattered.

Even in his pain, we made sure he felt love, comfort, and dignity. We stayed by his side, whispered our goodbyes, and laid him to rest with respect and compassion.

Every life deserves that much.

A NEW RESCUE

ONE OF THE CALF GOT A SECOND CHANCE IN LIFE

Alongside the brutally injured calf we found in Bhanjyang, we came across another calf just a few meters ahead—tied to the ground, shivering in the rain. We believe they were part of the same herd.

Thankfully, this little one had no visible injuries, but he was cold, drenched, and frightened. We rescued him safely and named him Hero—a name that reflects his quiet strength and resilience.

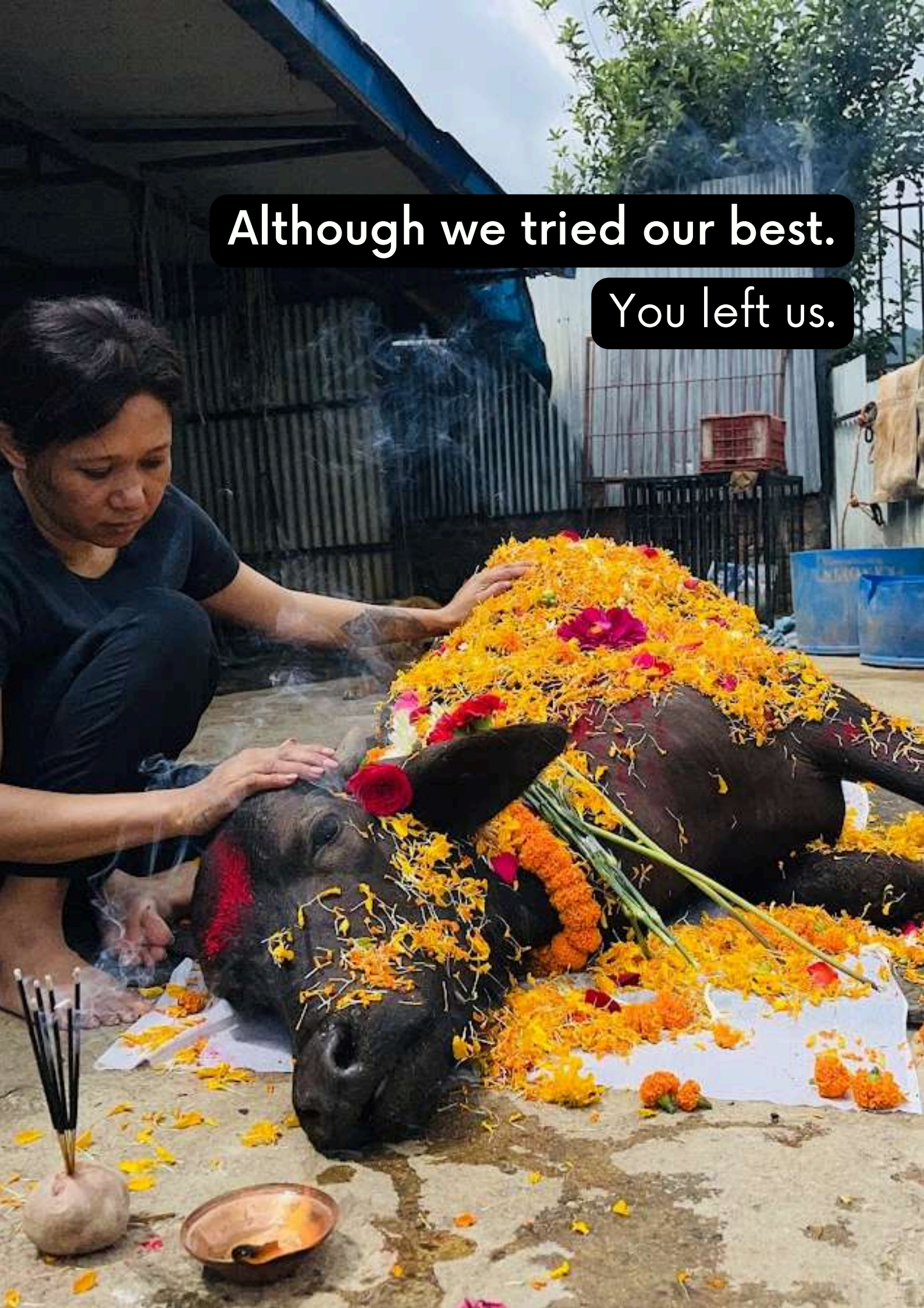
We immediately performed surgery to remove the objects. She is currently undergoing treatment after the surgery.

We would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to Dr. Arjun Aryal, who contributed with his expertise and dedication to such a risky and complex surgery.

We regularly take our farm animals to graze near the river, but sadly, the area has become a dumping ground for waste. Plastic, metal, and other harmful debris are carelessly discarded, posing serious health risks to the animals. We suspect that Maicha, one of our beloved rescues, may have accidentally ingested some of this garbage while grazing. Despite our team's constant monitoring and efforts to minimize these risks, it's heartbreaking that such harmful objects can still find their way into our animals' systems.

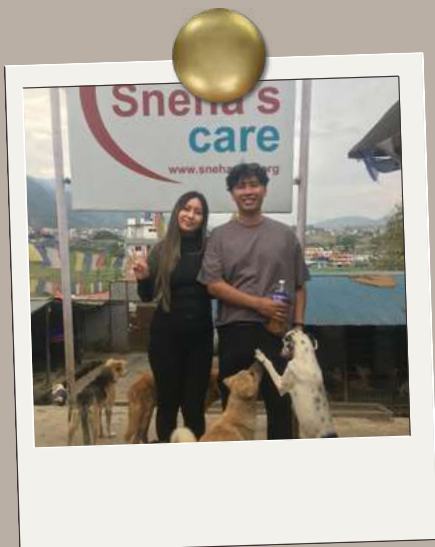
OUR DUTIES EXTEND BEYOND RESCUE

Rescuing an animal in distress is only the first step in our lifelong commitment to their well-being. What follows is a journey of care, healing, and protection.

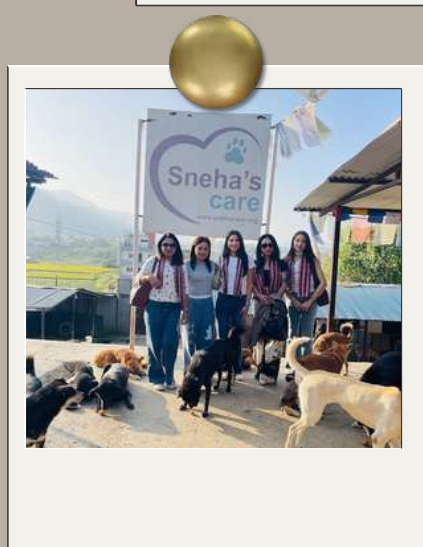
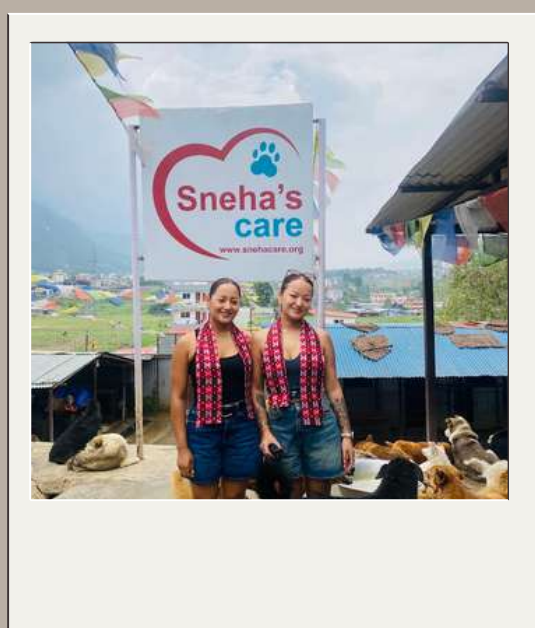
From providing a safe and secure place to rest, to daily medical care, extensive treatments, constant monitoring, nutritious food, and proper shelter—every aspect matters.

A Breed Dog's Story of Neglect and Rescue

Puggu once had a family. He wasn't born on the streets—he was once someone's beloved pet. But that love didn't last.

As he grew older and began showing signs of illness, his family chose convenience over compassion. They abandoned him. Left to fend for himself, Puggu wandered the streets—confused, fragile, and in pain.

Without the strength to defend himself, he was attacked by street dogs, barely surviving each day.

When we found him, he was malnourished, covered in wounds, and terrified of human touch. His big, sad eyes told us everything—we didn't know his full story, but we could feel the heartbreak.

We brought him to our shelter, treated his infections, and gave him a warm bed—something he hadn't known in a long time. Slowly, Puggu began to trust again. He started wagging his tail. He learned that not all humans give up on their animals.

Today, Puggu may still be old and a little fragile, but he is safe. He is loved. And he now calls our shelter his home. Puggu's story is a painful reminder that pets are not disposable. Age and illness are not reasons to abandon those who once trusted you with their whole heart.

She's slowly recovering physically and emotionally. She's learning to trust again. We hope that here, she finally feels what every animal deserves: safety, care, and unconditional love.

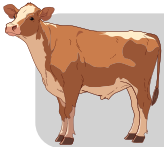

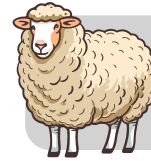

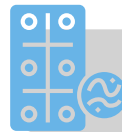
