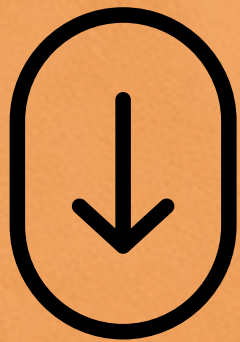

Rescue Zone



We were informed about a sick goat, and our team rushed to the location. When we arrived, her abdomen was swollen, she was extremely weak, and she struggled even to move her neck. We rescued her immediately and brought her to our shelter—only to find out she was pregnant.

Despite constant treatment and every effort, she couldn't survive. During the postmortem, we found something no mother should ever suffer through.. a massive piece of plastic inside her stomach. Alongside it were her two unborn babies, who had also lost their lives before ever seeing the world. This didn't happen because nature failed her.

This happened because we, humans, threw plastic carelessly into fields, into roadsides, into places where animals search for food.

A single piece of plastic became a slow, silent killer.





Jojo is an innocent victim of a hit-and-run. A reckless driver struck him and left him lying on the road, unable to move, in unimaginable pain. When we rushed him for X-rays, the results showed multiple spinal fractures, injuries so severe that Jojo may never walk again. our donation or sponsorship will help provide medical treatment, pain management, rehabilitation, and ongoing care to ensure he can live safely and comfortably. Approved Dairy Animal Welfare Standards in Bagmati , Madhesh & Gandaki



ISneha's Care, in collaboration with the Directorate of Livestock and Fisheries Development, conducted a series of capacity-building programs across Bagmati, Madhesh, and Gandaki Provinces to strengthen the implementation of approved Dairy Animal Welfare Standards in commercial farms.

The initiative included both task force training for provincial officers and practical trainings for commercial dairy farmers, ensuring comprehensive understanding and effective execution of welfare standards. More than 70 large-scale commercial dairy farmers participated, receiving hands-on guidance on Good Husbandry Practices (GHP), proper animal handling, housing, feeding, health management, and integrating welfare principles into daily farm operations. In addition, 45 provincial officers underwent structured task force training focused on monitoring, evaluating, and enforcing dairy animal welfare standards at the provincial and field levels.

Field visits were conducted at local Gaushalas, including facilities housing both indigenous and international breeds, to assess real-time welfare conditions. While basic standards of care were observed, several opportunities were identified to further improve space management, hygiene practices, and routine health monitoring, helping align these facilities with provincial and national welfare expectations.

These programs reaffirm our commitment to strengthening the implementation of Dairy Animal Welfare Standards in Nepal by empowering both farmers and provincial task force teams with the knowledge and tools needed to ensure humane, responsible, and welfare-based dairy farming practices.

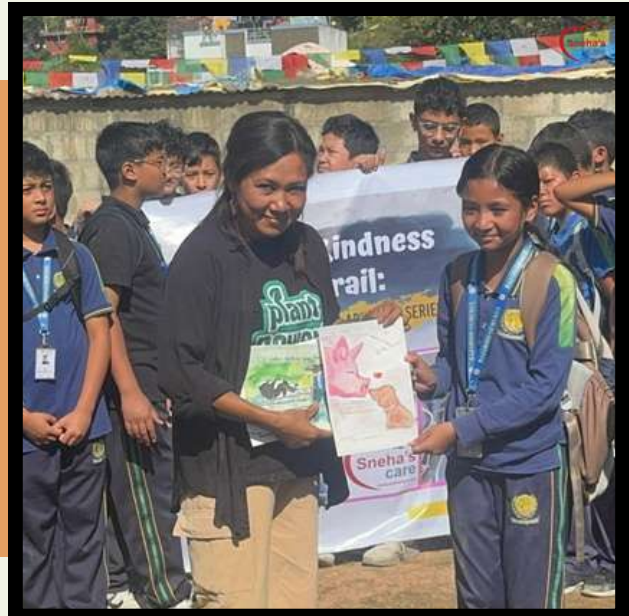


A Day Filled with Love

The Story of SNEHA

SHRESTHA'S Animal Sanctuary

SNEHA'S CARE, FOUNDED IN 2015 BY NEPALI ANIMAL RIGHTS ADVOCATE **SNEHA SHRESTHA**, IS A SANCTUARY DEVOTED TO RESCUING, REHABILITATING, AND ADVOCATING FOR ANIMALS IN NEED. FROM COMMUNITY DOGS TO FARM ANIMALS, THE ORGANIZATION PROVIDES SHELTER, MEDICAL CARE, AND PROTECTION AGAINST ABUSE, STRIVING TO ENSURE THAT EVERY ANIMAL LIVES WITH DIGNITY AND COMPASSION. WHAT BEGAN AS A DEEPLY PERSONAL MISSION AFTER THE TRAGIC LOSS OF HER BELOVED DOG, ZARA, HAS GROWN INTO A NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED INITIATIVE. TODAY, SNEHA AND HER TEAM HAVE RESCUED OVER 25,000 ANIMALS, EDUCATED COMMUNITIES, AND CHAMPIONED ANIMAL WELFARE LEGISLATION IN NEPAL.



Zara: The Catalyst for Compassion

Sneha's journey into animal welfare began with Zara, a small puppy who became like family. "Zara was more than a dog to me. She was my child in an animal's body," Sneha says. Every evening, Zara would greet her at the gate with a wagging tail, making even brief reunions moments of joy. But one day, Zara didn't appear. Sneha found her lying on the ground, poisoned by a neighbor who claimed her barking was disturbing. Despite desperate attempts, prayers, fasting, and medical care, Zara passed away. "This was a harsh awakening," Sneha recalls. "When I went to the police to file a complaint, the officer laughed at me. I realized that in Nepal, there were no laws, no welfare standards, no protection for animals. That painful truth ignited a fire in me. From that moment, I dedicated my life to these voiceless beings. Sneha's Care was born out of love, grief, and determination."

Zara's death marked a turning point in Sneha's life. She sank into deep depression. People laughed at her for grieving so deeply over a dog, but that pain opened her eyes. She began noticing the suffering of countless street animals: dogs with broken legs, maggot infestations, victims of hit-and-run accidents, or those deliberately abused by humans. "Zara taught me that humanity is not always shown by humans. Sometimes it comes from the innocent souls we care for. She became my motivation, my teacher of compassion, resilience, and love," Sneha explains. "Today, I am a better human because of her."

Building a Sanctuary

With no veterinary experience initially, Sneha took injured dogs to private clinics. Within a month, she had rescued over 50 animals. She arranged housing through a local kennel, paying 250 rupees per dog per day, but quickly realized that the number of animals in need far exceeded the available capacity. During this process, she witnessed the cruel reality: many animals were being deliberately abused, hit with vehicles, chopped with sharp objects, or scalded with hot water.

Driven by a vision to help more animals, Sneha sold her home and established her own shelter, formally registering Sneha's Care Animal Welfare Organization in 2015. Her compassion soon expanded beyond dogs to farm animals often subjected to cruelty. Male calves abandoned at birth, goats, pigs, and buffaloes exploited for food. Sneha recognized that systemic change required her to act. She also adopted a vegan lifestyle, striving to avoid contributing to animal suffering. Today, Sneha's Care provides refuge to over 200 animals, including community dogs, cows, buffaloes, goats, pigs, and more.

Changing Hearts and Laws

Sneha's Care is more than a sanctuary. It's a movement. The organization runs community awareness programs, school outreach initiatives, and vaccination campaigns, educating the next generation about empathy and responsibility toward animals.

Since 2015, Sneha has pushed for legislation through a Supreme Court writ petition that ruled in her favor. She contributed to drafting Nepal's Animal Welfare Act, now sent to the Ministry of Law, and introduced Dairy Animal Welfare Standards in all five provinces. The organization engages communities directly through anti-rabies campaigns, pamphlets, street dramas, and animal welfare festivals to instill compassion in young people.

Day to Day Life at the Shelter

A typical day at Sneha's Care begins at 5 a.m. with cooking fresh meals, vegetables and lentils, everything freshly prepared. Then comes cleaning cow, goat, and pig dung, washing wet



blankets, and sanitizing kennels. By 8 a.m., Sneha feeds cows, buffaloes, goats, and pigs, taking them out for a sunbath. At 10 a.m., 150 dogs are fed, their dishes cleaned, shelters sanitized, and treatment given to any sick or injured animals.

The organization cares for 200 animals at the shelter and receives over 20 rescue calls daily via social media. With a small team, they prioritize severe cases while mobile treatment teams handle minor cases and educate

communities. Managing monthly expenses of 10 to 12.3 lakh rupees for 22 staff members and supplies is challenging, yet every animal receives two meals daily, clean water, warm blankets, medical care, and love. During emergencies like the COVID-19 pandemic, the team fed 2,500 animals daily without a single day off. After the Jajarkot earthquake, they provided relief three times with medications and temporary shelters.
