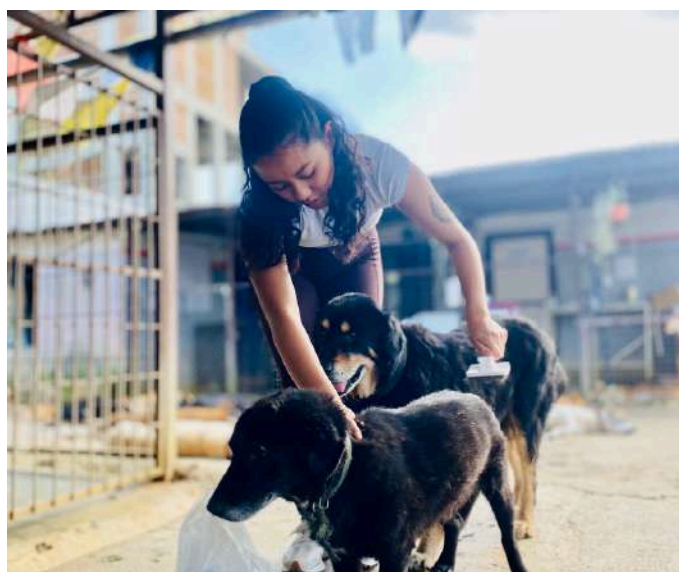


Volunteering at Sneha's Care: A Rewarding Experience

Reaching Those in Need



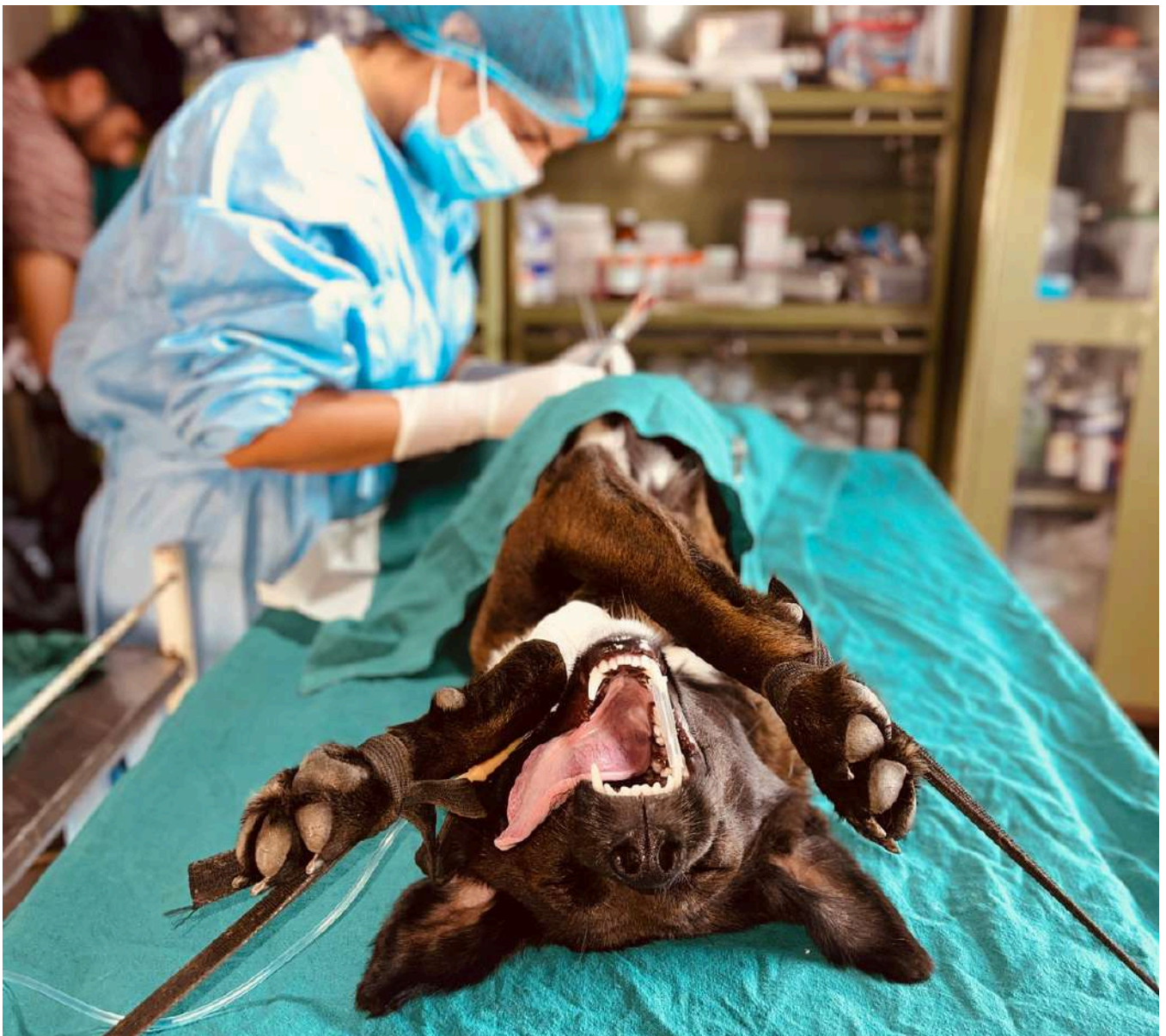
Mobile treatment is a vital way for us to reach animals in need, especially when rescuing every animal isn't possible—particularly as the number of cases continues to rise. By providing care directly in the communities, we also encourage a sense of responsibility among local residents, empowering them to look after the animals in their area.

While the ongoing flood monitoring and relief aid distribution programs limited our reach this month, we were still able to provide treatment to several animals in need. We remain committed to offering support wherever possible, and every case we assist makes a significant difference.



Animal Birth Control: A Key to Sustainable Animal Welfare

Sterilization is a crucial part of addressing the animal overpopulation crisis and promoting animal welfare. A single female dog and her offspring can produce over 67,000 puppies in just six years, and sterilizing one dog can prevent the birth of up to 27 puppies. This not only reduces the strain on local communities and shelters but also helps prevent the suffering caused by abandonment and neglect. Sterilization leads to healthier, happier animals, decreases the risk of disease, and ensures a more sustainable, compassionate approach to managing animal populations in the long term.



From Pain to Hope: The Latest Rescue Stories



We were alerted to this adorable puppy by a compassionate informant, who reported that the pup had been run over by a bike and sustained a deep wound to its throat. We are hopeful for the puppy's recovery and are doing everything we can to support its healing process.

Hissi came into Sneha's care with a severe wound on her shoulder, accompanied by an intense maggot infestation. She is fighting for her life, but we remain hopeful that she will recover soon..



Lapsi is a survivor of a hit-and-run accident, but unfortunately, the injuries left him paralyzed from the lower limbs, a condition he will face for the rest of his life.

Jacko arrived with a fractured jaw and severe maggot infestation in his mouth. Despite being an older dog with immense strength to endure the pain, we sadly lost him a few days after his rescue.



Aama is a victim of human abuse, with a deep cut on her thigh, likely inflicted by a khukuri. Despite the immense pain she endured, Aama remains a patient and gentle soul, especially protective of her babies. Although suffering greatly, she showed no signs of aggression toward anyone.

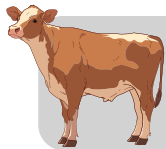

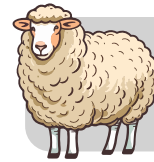

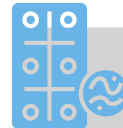
