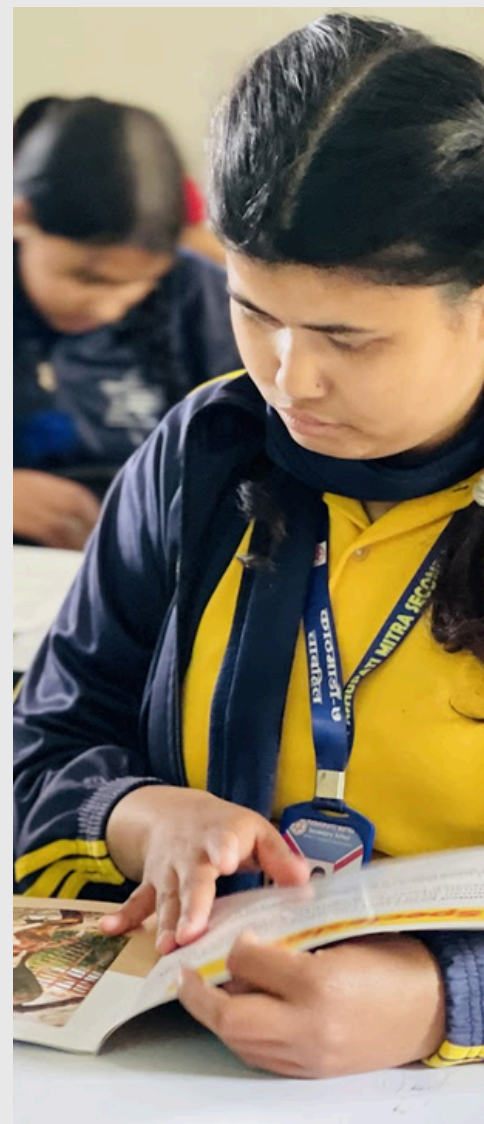

Mobile Treatment

We continue to reach as many animals as possible, offering care, relief, and hope to those who would otherwise be left without help.



Our mobile treatment team travels to areas where animals are in distress, providing on-site medical care exactly when it is needed most. From wound treatment to emergency support, every visit is driven by urgency and compassion.



Even with limited resources and ongoing challenges, our commitment remains unwavering to stand by every animal who needs treatment and ensure they are not left to suffer alone.

Our goal is to ensure that every animal who comes to us for help is treated with care and compassion, stabilized, and safely returned to their community once recovered.

SHADOW'S FIGHT AGAINST JAUNDICE



Shadow was found in a severely weak condition, showing clear signs of jaundice. Her eyes and gums had turned yellow, her body was lethargic, and she had completely lost her appetite. Barely able to stand and visibly deteriorating,

Shadow urgently needed medical intervention. Recognizing the seriousness of her condition, our team rescued her and brought her safely to the shelter.

Upon arrival, Shadow was given immediate medical attention. She is now under constant observation, receiving supportive treatment, medication, fluids, and proper nutrition to help stabilize her liver function and rebuild her strength.

Our team is closely monitoring her progress each day, providing gentle care and comfort as she slowly works toward recovery

Jaundice in dogs is a serious medical condition that causes a yellow discoloration of the eyes, gums, ears, and skin. Jaundice itself is not a disease but a sign of an underlying problem. It can be caused by liver infections, toxins, blood disorders, tick-borne diseases, or bile duct obstruction.

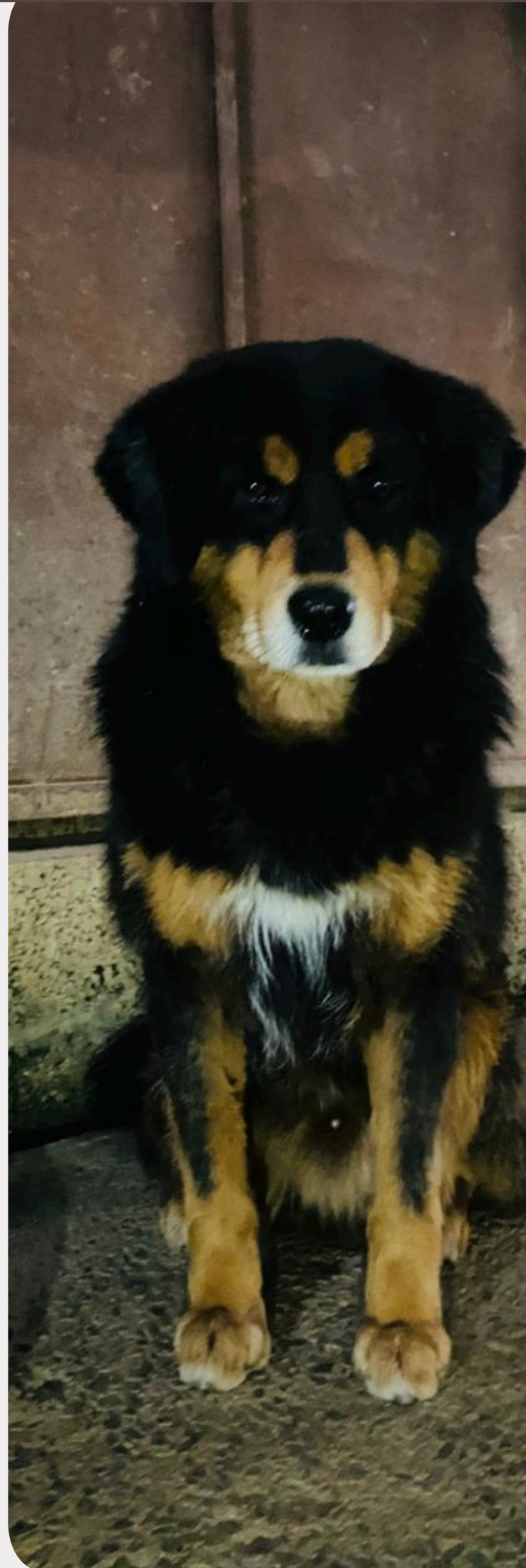
Please keep an eye on the community animals around you. If you notice yellowing of the eyes or gums, extreme weakness, or loss of appetite, seek medical help immediately. Early intervention can save a life.

BEYOND THE AGGRESSION: TYSON'S STORY

Tyson was reported by the community as an aggressive dog, and we received multiple calls expressing concern about his behavior. Worried for both his safety and the safety of those around him, our team stepped in and rescued Tyson, bringing him safely to our shelter.

He is now under careful observation and compassionate care. Often, what appears as aggression is actually fear, trauma, or untreated pain. Dogs react when they feel threatened or misunderstood.

Our team is patiently working to understand Tyson's behavior, giving him the time, space, and support he needs to feel secure. With proper care and trust-building, we hope to help him relax, heal, and show his true nature.



UNDERSTANDING AGGRESSION IN DOGS

Dogs often tend to show aggression when they are afraid, in pain, stressed, or feeling threatened. What looks like anger is usually a survival response. For many street or previously abused dogs, reacting defensively is the only way they know how to protect themselves.

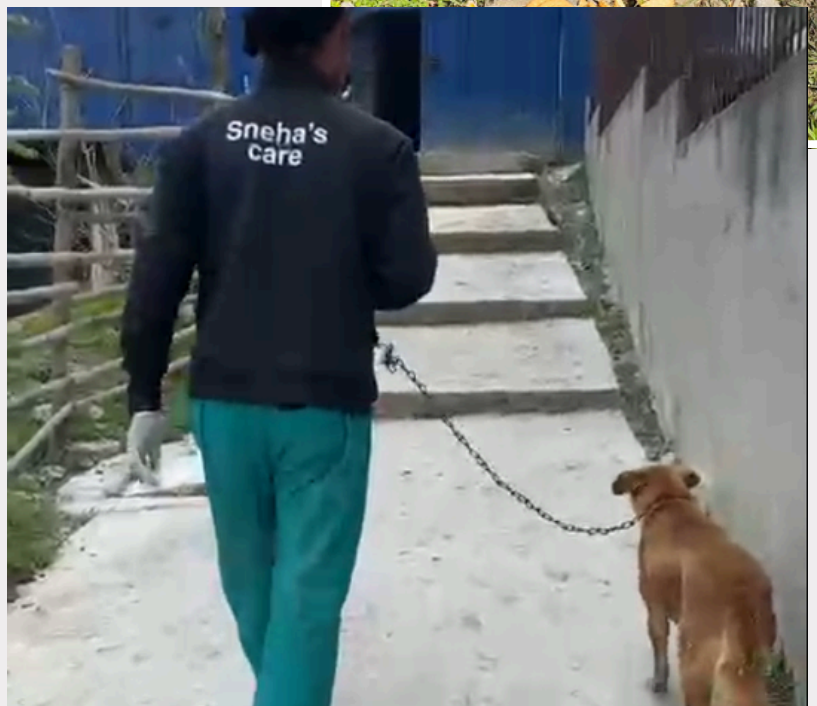
Unfortunately, people often misinterpret this behavior as the dog being “bad” or dangerous. Instead of seeing the fear or discomfort behind the reaction, the aggression becomes the label.

In reality, most aggressive behavior is a sign that the dog needs care, patience, and understanding — not punishment. When we look beyond the reaction, we can begin to address the real cause and help them feel safe again.

Another Life Given a Chance

We recently rescued another dog who was reported as aggressive by the community. Multiple concerns were raised about his behavior, and tensions were rising in the area. To ensure the safety of both the dog and the residents, our team stepped in and brought him to the shelter.

He is now under observation, receiving proper care and assessment. Our team is working patiently to understand his behavior and provide the support he needs to feel safe. With time, compassion, and the right approach, many misunderstood dogs begin to show their calmer, trusting side.



HERO'S ROAD TO RECOVERY : FROM TRAUMA TO TRUST

Hero is now healing and showing encouraging signs of recovery. He is slowly regaining his strength and, most beautifully, beginning to trust humans again. He remains under careful observation as he continues to recover both physically and emotionally.

His head wound is responding well to treatment, and the swelling has significantly reduced. With regular dressing, medication, and close monitoring, his body is gradually stabilizing. He is eating better each day, staying hydrated, and even wagging his tail when familiar faces approach.



Emotionally, the journey is just as important. After enduring such cruelty, fear was natural. But with gentle handling, patience, and constant reassurance from our team, Hero is slowly opening his heart again. Small moments like allowing a soft touch or resting peacefully beside his caregivers remind us how resilient he truly is.

Healing takes time, but Hero is fighting every single day. And we are right beside him, every step of the way.

LEGAL UPDATE

The culprit fled the scene, and hasn't been found yet but a police report has been filed. We are committed to pursuing justice and will not stop until the perpetrator is held accountable. What is equally heartbreaking is that bystanders watched as this cruelty unfolded and did nothing to stop it. Hero's suffering is a reminder that silence enables violence.

Hero survived unimaginable brutality but he is still here. And we stand with him, fighting for his healing and for justice.

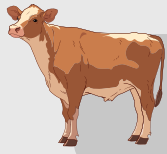
