A group of monkeys in Taplejung was found confined, attacked, and subjected to inhumane treatment. Our team documented the situation and filed a complaint with the authorities, ensuring that proper evidence was collected to hold those responsible accountable.

Thanks to these efforts, the Nepal Police and the District Police Office, Taplejung have arrested the individual involved, and the case is now under investigation.

By taking swift action, we not only protect wildlife but also send a strong message that cruelty toward animals will never be tolerated.

## A DISTURBING REALITY: GAUSHALA IN SURKHET



In Birendranagar-11, Surkhet, a gaushala exposed a deeply troubling situation. Nearly 200 cows and calves were found hungry, sick, and injured. With the caretaker absent and grazing neglected, the animals were left to suffer without basic care.

This heartbreaking case highlights the urgent need for accountability, proper management, and immediate action to ensure that gaushalas truly serve as places of protection not neglect.



## *A Sanctuary of Care:*

### *Kamdhenu Gaushala, Butwal*

As part of our efforts to implement Dairy Animal Welfare Standards in commercial dairy farms, we also monitored several gaushalas, including Kamdhenu Gaushala in Butwal, Rupandehi.

Kamdhenu Gaushala in Butwal, Rupandehi, stands as a powerful example of compassion in action. Home to over 400 cows and calves, it provides a safe haven for the abandoned, injured, and forgotten.

Under the guidance of Yogi Somraj and his team, the animals receive proper shelter, nourishment, medical care, and, above all, love and dignity. It is a reminder that with dedication and empathy, gaushalas can truly become places of healing and hope.



# MORE THAN JUST MILK



Behind every drop of milk are stories of separation and pain and this little calf is one of them.

Abandoned in the wilderness, this calf was left to face hunger and fear alone. One didn't survive... but this brave soul is still here, holding on to life and hope.

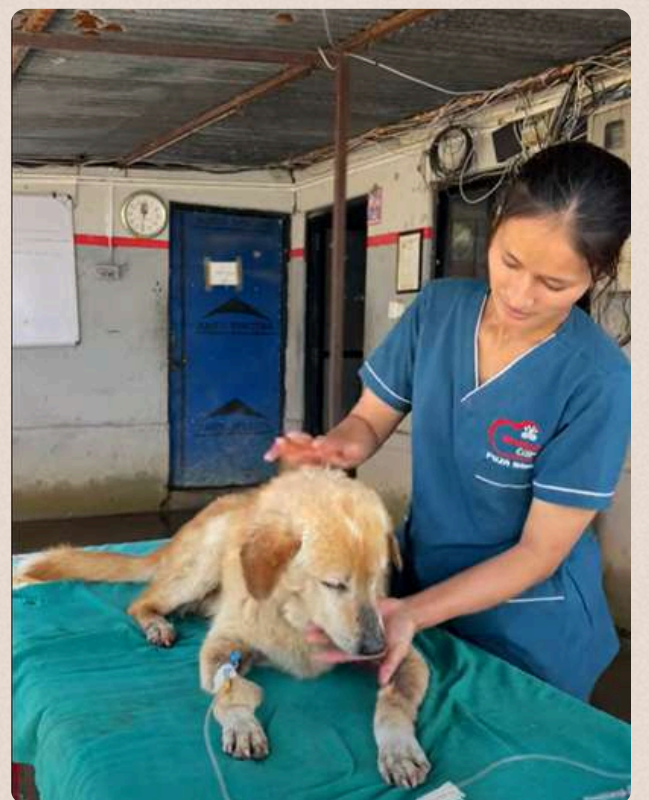
# Lucky's Fight for Life

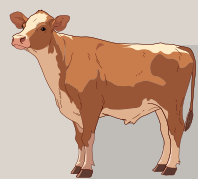
